Now celebrating its 11th anniversary, this event provides a unique forum for attendees to share policy developments, research results, and practical solutions to engineering hydrology issues. This year's conference will encompass the full spectrum of innovative developments in the fields of Catchment based Flood Risk Management, Surface Water and Groundwater Hydrology. The conference will focus on new approaches in hydrology that will benefit practitioners.

CALL FOR PAPERS

Participants willing to contribute to the Conference through the presentation of a paper should submit a short abstract (maximum 500 words). The abstracts should be sent by post or Email to the Conference Secretariat by **16th July**. The organising committee will review the abstracts and inform the authors of the acceptance by 1st August. Final manuscripts for accepted papers are required to be submitted in digital format no later than the **3rd October**. Papers, which should be practically oriented, on experience or methodologies relevant to Ireland would be particularly welcome.

POSTER SESSION / DISPLAYS

Participants willing to contribute through the provision of a poster display should submit a short summary (maximum 300 words) of the project or topic. The deadlines for submissions and the review and acceptance format and dates are as per papers above.

CONFERENCE BOOKINGS AND COST

Demand for places at the previous Conferences has been high. Places are allocated on a first-come basis, and **pre-booking is essential** (using the form provided overleaf). The cost of attendance at the conference is €120 per person (with a limited Student rate of €40), which includes a Book of Proceedings, refreshments and lunch. Invoices will be issued following receipt of registration forms requesting the reservation of a place. Receipts will only be issued upon demand.
