Unlocking Solutions for a Resilient Water Future

Groundwater is the most crucial resource for meeting global freshwater needs. Facing climate change, growing demand, and increasing pressures on water resources, this forum focuses on how groundwater can secure sustainable and future-proof water supplies. The program adds to the discussions at IWA Copenhagen 2022, IWA Toronto 2024 and other recent events. The Groundwater Forum will contribute to the overall theme of the congress: *“Water action – the path to resilience and prosperity”*.

The format of the sessions is expected to be highly interactive, promoting dialogue by sharing experience and knowledge by having a combination of lectures, dialogue fora and other interactive methods.
